
Revitalizing Waste, Reshaping Futures: A Finnish-Namibian Initiative

Turning Trash into Treasure rethinks, resuses and reinvents waste materials to bring about sustainability and positive change. A collaboration between the University of Eastern Finland and the University of Namibia, this project showcases how transforming waste creates environmental, social, and economic benefits – turning challenges into opportunities.

In 2021, a skills audit conducted in 9 Namibian Correctional Facilities uncovered artistic talents amongst inmates. With high unemployment and poverty fueling crime in Namibia, this initiative provides social entrepreneurship and circular economy training to empower inmates, break cycles of poverty and support their integration into society.

Through a circular economy appoach, these institutions transform solid waste into valuable art and crafts.

Promoting positive change in prisons leads to better outcomes not only for indivudals but society!

The project highlights the importance of rethinking, reusing, and reinventing discarded materials. This transformative approach boosts creativity and resilience while promoting community-wide positive change.
